## The Lodge

### *Location*

The lodge (often referred to just as “AAC” or sometimes “the Huette” – German for “hut”) is on the edge of the Village ski bowl, near the base of the Eagle and Summit chairlifts. It is also a short walk to the nightlife and local restaurants.

### **Facilities**

The lodge has twelve bedrooms, each consisting of a combination of double bed and double plus single bed layouts, all with ensuite bathrooms. There are also three bunkrooms, which sleep four, five or six people.

A large living/dining area with a mezzanine lounge and fireplace provide a pleasant and relaxing après ski environment. There is a TV/video room, a games room with table soccer, table tennis and snooker table, an indoor spa and sauna. Laundry facilities are also provided.

### **Services**

A full-time lodge manager is employed to ensure that members and guests are welcomed to the lodge. The lodge is open all year.

Winter tariffs are excellent value and include a cooked breakfast every morning during peak season. A modern well-equipped kitchen is available for the use of members and their guests.

Linen is provided during the ski season, beds are made for arrival and rooms are cleaned upon departure.
